We work with over 1100 people a week in various settings including our own clinics in Kingswood, Penrith, Glenbrook and Annangrove, hospitals, aged care facilities, schools, disability providers and various other community settings.

We assist a broad range of people and challenges through our programs including newborns and Mums struggling to work each other out, kids with autism, veterans with post-traumatic stress disorders, older adults with dementia, adults and kids with various disabilities and/or mental health challenges, cancer patients and school aged kids struggling with anxiety or antisocial behaviour.

Regardless of age or affliction, the results achieved through music therapy are consistently astounding.

While many of our clients are funded by the National Disability Insurance Scheme, there is an ongoing need to raise funds to continue to expand the reach of our services, to fund instruments and to enable research to inform our practice to further improve outcomes.
